

Lithichrome AEROSOL SHADOW . . .

Shadow is available in aerosol pressure cans in Black, Grey, Brown, Hilite (white) and Gold only. Since a portion of any aerosol can must be used for the propellant gas, no aerosol can compare with the Airmite for spraying economy. Aerosols are not recommended for production but are handy for cemetery use or when shop air is abnormally wet. **Certain high test gasolines may dissolve aerosol Hilite or Shadow although they do not affect regular Shadow or Hilite. In this event, the solution is to stop using highly flammable gasoline for cleaning, using instead a non-flammable naphtha at a lower cost. Any naphtha (mineral spirits) with a KB value of around 36 is O.K. No aerosol will spray well when cold. Hold can about ten inches from stone. Too far will result in a "dry" spray.**

NOTE: For trouble-free results PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY.

BEFORE USING, ROTATE THE SPRAY HEAD ABOUT 1/4 TURN. ROTATE IT OCCASIONALLY AND YOU WILL NEVER HAVE A CLOGGED SPRAY HEAD. NEVER STICK A PIN OR ANY SHARP OBJECT IN THE SPRAY HEAD HOLE. IF CLOGGED, REMOVE SPRAY HEAD AND RUN FINGERNAIL THROUGH THE SLOT IN THE BASE OF THE SPRAY HEAD. REPLACE THE SPRAY HEAD WITH A GENTLE TWISTING MOTION. SHAKE CAN OCCASIONALLY TO INSURE PROPER MIXTURE. AFTER USE TURN CAN UPSIDE DOWN AND THE VALVE PRESSED FOR A FEW MOMENTS. THIS CLEANS OUT THE ATOMIZER HOLE LEAVING THE CAN READY FOR USE.

BLACK SHADOW AEROSOL—Identical in color and in spraying qualities to regular Black Shadow. (Read data above relative to all aerosols.)

GREY SHADOW AEROSOLS—This Grey Shadow is formulated to be used as either a Light or Dark Grey, as by applying a little more, a darker tone is obtained.

AEROSOL HILITE

Aerosol Hilite is not recommended for regular shop production since it cannot compare with the Airmite in spraying economy. However, it has many uses. A great many old monuments and markers have V sunk lettering in polished face, with no contrast whatever. With a Hilite aerosol these can be made legible in a few moments with no masking required. Simply remove the Hilite getting on the polish with a cloth wet with Lithco Solvent. Dull ugly panels and floral carvings can be restored in the same manner. It is amazing what a little contrasting can do to old monuments and, as a goodwill builder, it has few equals. Try it—the monument owner will be delighted. Never hold the aerosol can so far away that a "dry" application is the result as this cannot be permanent. **Certain high test gasolines will dissolve Aerosol Hilite which have no effect on regular Hilite. The solution is to use a non-flammable naphtha (mineral spirits) at a lower cost for cleaning.**
